GLOSSARY AND PRONUNCIATION GUIDE

ASGARD (az-gard): the home of the Norse gods

CRONE: an old woman

LEMMINGS: small, short-tailed, furry-footed rodents that live in northern regions

LOKI (lob-kee): the trickster in Norse mythology, often identified as Thor's brother

MIDGARD SERPENT: a giant serpent that circles the earth, according to Norse legend

MJOLNIR (my-uhl-neer): Thor's magic hammer

MORTAL: a being that dies

ODIN (ob-din): father of the Norse gods

THOR: the Norse god of Thunder

UTGARD-LOKI (oot-gard lob-kee): king of the Norse giants
